

Initiatives for indigenous and new immigrant communities:

Cathay Charity Group provided support to the development of indigenous communities by sponsoring the tribes' cultural and education expenses. In addition, Cathay also provided aids in developing tourism so as to create job opportunities for indigenous tribes. In terms of the support for the new immigrant communities, Cathay continued to organize Leadership Development Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants, helping the children to develop multiculturalism, language abilities and expand their potential. Courses of the 2022 program were adapted due to the pandemic. Participants were encouraged to think about solutions for problems they saw and put what they learned into practice.

Education initiatives:

Since 2011, Cathay Charity Group has actively looked for partners to establish After-school Care Programs, providing a place for the children under neglect. The impact from the pandemic exposed the scarcity of digital resources in the remote country. To solve the problems for the children, the 2022 TFT program channeled in multiple resources and made adaptation to their training program, making the enhancement of digital capacity as priority. The program participants then led the students and faculty to address the brand-new teaching model for the goal of bridging the urban and country gap in education.

Social charity:


The summer blood donation campaign has become Cathay's yearly routine event. Originally, we thought the it wouldn't be easy to collect blood donation due to the impact of COVID. With Cathay and Taiwan Blood Services Foundation's join-hand promotional efforts, however, donors flooded in to support our event and the result turned out to be record-breaking again. Considering the pandemic's wide-spread impact, Cathay Charity Foundation coordinated the Tree Buy Shopping platform for the first time to launch aiding programs: recruiting buyers for Joyce Polio Care Association's organic rice to be donated to the low-income households in Changhua County. Furthermore, Cathay worked with Cathay's affiliated hotels donating 400 boxes of mooncakes to elementary schools located in remote country for children to feel the love during the important holiday. Despite the increased difficulties, the annual events including Winter Warmth Program, Tree-planting, and Elevated Tree Program--Charitable Painting Exhibition still achieved great results, delivering contribution to environmental causes and under-privileged communities.

Promotion of sports and arts:

With its long-term sponsorship to the National Oil Painting Contest and Exhibition, Cathay United Bank Foundation intended to encourage local artists and hoped to bring arts closer to the general public. Viewers would be able to feel the positivity conveyed through paintings. In terms of sports events, the 2022 Elevated Tree Program sponsored quite a few teams which achieved outstanding results in domestic and international competitions. By supporting the athletes to go to the competitions, Cathay hoped to help them expand their horizon and confidence, chase their dreams and encourage younger ones to follow their examples.

Over the six decades, Cathay Charity Group had received lots of support from partners and members. Looking ahead, Cathay shall continue growing further so as to carry more responsibilities and respond to people's expectation on us. May the big tree of Cathay grow and flourish. We look forward to celebrating the 100 years of anniversary in the future.

2022 Annual Work Progress Report for Cathay Charity Foundation

The year of 2022 marked the 60th anniversary of Cathay Financial Holding Group. "You are braver than you think you are!" An encouragement to the entire staff given by the group-wide Chairman Hong-Tu Tsai. He also urged all the Cathay people to keep moving forward, challenge and defeat the impossible, with an open-minded and fearless thinking to explore, to make decisions and to bear the accountabilities. Holding onto this spirit, Cathay Charity Foundation continued to practice the concept of "Spreading Happiness and Hope", committing ourselves to various kinds of causes including environmental protection, supporting the poor and the underprivileged, empowerment for children and youth and the senior care.

Meanwhile, Cathay integrated the Group and cross-industry resources and creates common good by connecting the strengths from the industry, government and the academics. Especially, in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, Cathay Charity Foundation responded immediately by attending to the health of medical professionals and their families. The utilization of Cathay's charity platform "Tree Buy Shopping" also helped reduce human contacts during the pandemic. Public welfare and care was infused into "corporate sustainability" and delivered to those in need. In the year of 2022, the total expenditure was NT\$ 28,387,044 (US\$ 916,302). The information of the major expenditure is described as below:

I. Social Welfare

1. Care program for 2nd generation immigrants

Leadership Development Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants was conducted with the following goals: providing long-term companionship, cultivating multiculturalism, growing language abilities, and nurturing decent characters for children. A total of 60 programs was held in 2022, benefiting more than 1,036 participants.

- 2. Empowerment Programs
 - (1) Dream Come True Program: The Dream Come True Program is a way to help children achieve what they want to do. With their teachers' guidance and the Program's spon-

sorship, children are able to complete great tasks in the fields of environmentalism, science, art, music and sports. The course of the journey helps enrich their education and nurture their independent thinking. The 2022 Dream Come True Program selected 20 schools and presented prizes in total of NT\$ 3.62 million (US\$ 116,850).

- (2) After-school Care Program: working with Chongwen Women's Association of Yunlin, Little Grass Book House of Sanxia, and Let Love Fly of Hualien to establish after-school care program. This program offered tutorial sessions to 73 children to improve their learning.
- (3) Cooperation with Teach For Taiwan (TFT)
 - In this year again, Cathay Charity Group launched a three-year (2022-2024) cooperation with TFT where Cathay's three foundations jointly support TFT in recruiting and training teachers for remote countries. This initiative supports young teachers to teach in remote countries, creating a fair and premium environment for those children and flip the education quality in these places.
- 3. Youth and Talent Development
 - (1) Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship: Co-organized by Cathay Charity Foundation, Cathay United Bank Foundation, and Cathay Real Estate Foundation, the Scholarship provides monetary funds to support young people with aspirations. This program presented scholarships to two groups of awardees: Specific Accomplishment Group (24) and Academic Group (65) for them to chase their dreams. In 2022, a total scholarship of NT\$ 7.38 million (US\$ 238,218) was granted to 89 groups of young people.
 - (2) Mixed Disabled Troupe: Cathay Charity Foundation has worked with Mixed Disabled Troupe, a group consisting of disabled performers, for a long time. In 2002, the group conducted 7 charitable performances in schools, interpreting their life stories and presenting important values to 5,000 young people.
 - (3) Volunteer services collaboration with University Clubs: Extending care to remote country and new immigrant children, Cathay Charity Foundation worked with University

clubs by sponsoring university clubs' winter and summer activities. In this category, 23 cases received sponsorship of NT\$ 58,077 (US\$ 1,875).

4. Winter Warmth Program

The 2022 Winter Warmth was held at 108 elementary schools in the remote country where resources were hard to arrive, sending winter clothing to children and benefiting more than 8,800 people.

5. Senior Care

With community public life as the central concept, Cathay volunteers and local communities work together to establish interactions with local seniors. Cathay Charity Foundation has built four Happy Farms, intending to achieve the goals of happy senior life and mutual good and reciprocity within communities. Also, in order to keep the seniors away from fraudulent traps, Cathay held 51 anti-fraud board games, benefiting 2,688 people.

- 6. Support for the Underprivileged
 - (1) Subsidies for low-income households and medical services

This program supported 141 cases with a total fund of NT\$ 1.691 million (US\$ 54,584) in 2022, helping them to resolve difficulties in life or to take care of poor children who need medical care urgently. In addition, the promotion of micro insurances was targeted towards middle to low income households and the disabled.

(2) Other social welfare donation

Helping the social welfare groups by purchasing products from Joyce Polio Care Association's workshop, New Taipei City Autism Association, Chiayi County Ruojuer Children's Development Center, Hearty Farm Sheltered Workshop, Children Are Us Tainan Workshop and providing donations to these organizations and low-income households. The total expenditure for the above mentioned was NT\$ 22,487,123 (US\$ 725,859).

II. Social and Environmental Events

1. Summer Blood Donation Campaign

Due to the pandemic, it wasn't easy to conduct blood donation activities. Cathay Charity Foundation continued to work with Taiwan Blood Services Foundation in holding the blood donation campaign. The campaign achieved a record high by receiving support from about 46,046 donors and collecting 70,168 bags of blood.

2. Tree-planting

Cathay utilizes group-wide resources to support the tree-planting events held in March by local governments. In 2022, Cathay participated in only two events due to the pandemic. The tree-planting events were meant for building sustainable life and protecting our environment for our society.

3. Anti-drug Awareness Campaign

To address the drug issue, Cathay Charity Foundation worked with the stunt performing group Han Dong H.D.A. and Against Wind Theatre to conduct anti-drug tour through a variety of performance, dance, play, experience sharing and singing. These gigs that could attract students more easily laid a basis for creating drug-free campuses. Cathay also worked with the National Police Agency to shoot an anti-drug documentary for this cause.

The total expenditure for the above mentioned was NT\$ 5,899,921 (US\$ 190,443).

2022 Annual Work Progress Report for Cathay United Bank Foundation

In 2022, Cathay United Bank Foundation implemented all works, including education for children, charity and public welfare, art events and sponsorship, in accordance with its annual work plan. In the year of 2022, the total expenditure was NT\$ 44,072,978 (US\$ 1,422,627). The information of the major expenditures is as follows:

I. Education for Children

1. Elevated Tree Program—Grow A Big Tree From A Shoot

The Foundation continued the carrying out of the Elevated Tree Program, helping the basic education to take root and ensuring children's access to school and further a future of their own. In 2022, the Elevated Tree Program supported 8,200 under-privileged junior high and elementary school students.

At the same time, the Program extended its focus to sports events, as in line with its spirit-growing a big tree. The Program supported the physical education at different junior high schools and elementary schools so that children were able to learn self-discipline and team spirit in large sports events and discover themselves through competitions. In 2022, Cathay sponsored the soccer team of Shuei Li Elementary School (in Nantou County) and the other 31 sports teams to participate in competitions, pay for training and purchase gear. Cathay also sponsored the Sunrise Village Cup National Junior Football Game.

To improve children's capabilities through diversified learning, and to bridge the urban-rural gap, promote sustainable development and life-long learning, Cathay also supported ten schools including Changhua County's Siang Tian Elementary School to develop their own special curriculum. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 15,191,447 (US\$ 490,363).

2. Campaigns organized across Cathay Charity Group

The co-organized projects include Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship, Teach For Taiwan, Dream Come True Program, After School Care Program in the remote country, Winter Warmth Program and the production of Cathay Charity Group Annual Report. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 5,715,333 (US\$ 184,485).

II. Charity, Public Welfare and Sponsoring Activities

To support the development of indigenous communities and social enterprises, Cathay purchased their self-made products from the Yu-Cheng Social Welfare Foundation and Pintung Christian Bethany Home. Also, Cathay provided sponsorship to the Bunun Cultural and Educational Foundation, Pintung Christian Bethany Home, Vox Nativa Taiwan and TMC Culture and Arts Foundation, with real actions to support the indigenous tourism, help the under-privileged, and spread the seeds of music for the children in the remote country. Furthermore, Cathay sponsored the 85th Tai-Yang Art Exhibition and the 46th National Oil Painting Contest and Exhibition organized by the Oil Art Society. The total expenditure for the above was NT\$ 2,705,350 (US\$ 87,326).

III. Art Events

In order to support local arts and art education, Cathay United Art Center has been regularly holding art expositions and Art Lectures, providing a platform for Taiwan's artists and free access to art appreciation and knowledge for the general public. Cathay's arts events in 2022 included 11 art exhibitions and 6 Art Talk Lecture Series, including 3 rounds of Elevated Tree Program charitable exhibition featuring amateur artists and aiming to help the remote country children. Furthermore, Cathay Group produced its corporate art calendar "Discover Happiness in Flowers" with local artists' works, intending to deliver the beauty of art and the sentiment of happiness. The total expenditure for the above was NT\$ 1,109,650 (US\$ 35,818).

2022 Annual Work Progress Report for Cathay Real Estate Foundation

Cathay Real Estate Foundation had implemented its annual plan of 2022: promoting the cultures and arts, spreading the concept of charity to help the under-privileged, and bringing happiness to others for a better society. The Foundation's affiliated Lin Yuan Libraries are located in major cities around Taiwan, providing an easy access to knowledge. Lin Yuan Libraries offered talent courses in the neighborhoods for the locals enrich their relationship with others. Moreover, the Foundation organized Summer Blood Donation Campaign, New Immigrant Care program, Winter Warmth Program, and Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship, delivering strength to more people. Its sponsorship to Teach For Taiwan aimed at sending young teachers with aspirations to transform the landscape of education in the remote country. The total expenditure for the above was NT\$ 9,500,447 (US\$ 30,664).

I. Lin Yuan Libraries

Knowledge is like the source of running water that never dries out, which can nurture people's mind. The Foundation has nine library branches around Taiwan, offering quiet and comfortable space for readers. The in-house collections of magazines and books are renewed monthly, providing sources of knowledge and wisdom to the users. Lin Yuan Libraries also functions as an alternative for people to relax and reboot amidst the fast-pacing modern life style.

II. In-library Courses

The Foundation provides regular talent classes in Lin Yuan Libraries where participants can develop their interest in hobbies into bigger learning motivation. The courses that combined creativity and imagination resulted in unique works by participants who also enjoyed the class-room vibe and harmonious peer relationships. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 89,600 (US\$ 2,892).

III. Campaigns organized across Cathay Charity Group

1. Taiwan's new immigrants

The unique community of Taiwan's new immigrants had come across ocean to Taiwan and worked hard to survive in this foreign environment. The causes for the new immigrants were implemented with the goals of helping them adapt to the society, avoiding conflicts arising from cultural differences and language barriers, providing training to skills and other professional areas and further helping them to become independent financially. The offering of education programs was meant to support their second generation to build a solid life and future on this land. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 250,000 (US\$ 8,070).

2. Summer Blood Donation Campaign

The Foundation organized Summer Blood Donation Campaign as in past years, encouraging people to roll up their sleeves and donate blood to help others in need. Small drops of warm blood would accumulate, telling people there is hope for a bright and promising future. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 50,000 (US\$ 1,614).

3. Winter Warmth Program and Dream Come True Program

Resources were gathered to help remote mountainous areas with scarcity and inconvenient transportation, so that people there could live well in the severe winter. Love is warm like sunshine, melting the cold hard ice in people's heart. Children smiled happily in their sweet hometown.

4. Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship

To build a foundation and cultivate talents for the development of our country, Cathay launched the Scholarship program to encourage young people to seek opportunities and chase dreams. They are incentivized by reaching balanced development and caring our planet and devoting to charity. They are inspired to bear social responsibilities and explorative spirit. The total expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 400,000 (US\$ 12,912).

5. Sponsorship to Teach For Taiwan

Committed to improving the inequality in education, Cathay has established long-term cooperation with Teach For Taiwan and bringing teachers to the remote country. The project intends to realize equality strategy and respond to the challenges to create diverse and premium education environment, supporting children to stand firm and move forward in their life journey. Cathay Real Estate Foundation's expenditure in this regard was NT\$ 500,000 (US\$ 16,139).

Providing Premium Education Resources to New Immigrant Families to Support the 2nd Generation

Cathay working with Eden to expand horizon for the 2nd Generation Immigrants

The opening ceremony of Leadership Development Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants was hosted by two of the program's long-term participants.

Camp for 2nd Generation Immigrants with Eden Social Welfare Foundation since 2019. The program was conducted with the following goals: providing long-term companionship, expanding horizon for children, cultivating multiculturalism, and growing language abilities. Curriculums were designed and constantly adjusted based on children's age and needs so that they can learn multicultures and grow into

decent characters. A total of 60 programs was held in 2022, with 1,036 participants.

The result for 2022 program is described as follows:

(1) The opening ceremony was hosted by two of the 2nd generation immigrant students

On March 26, the 2022 Opening Ceremony

was held at the Wanhua New Immigrant Hall. Pingting and Chunchie, two students who have joined the program for more than 10 years, served as the emcees for the ceremony. They showed confidence and established examples for junior students.

(2) Cathay United Bank's instructors combine their core competencies to the program

Cathay injected the Group's core competency to the program. Cathay United Bank's trainer Ms. Huiching Chiu and four volunteers from Human Resources designed a "Big Trip Tour Group", introducing the relevant financial including opening account, money saving, book-keeping, reasonable buying, and accidents and insurance for the children.

Bank is a term that is both familiar and strange to these young children. Cathay United Bank's volunteers set up a miniatured bank counter in the classroom. Students used toy stamps and passbooks to "open accounts" and "withdraw money". The incentives they received could even be saved to earn interest. Students learned these banking practices through real scenarios.

The parents who were present also raised questions regarding their children's problematic purchasing behaviors. The instructor used real cases to explain reasonable buying with real cases, leading the students to reflect their own purchasing behavior and realize the true meaning of reasonable buying.

This program received 89% satisfaction rate

from the students. Some parents even gave feedback saying that such fun and close to life group activity made children understand more about money. Parents and children benefited from the course and they were thankful to Cathay and the instructor.

(3) Post-Covid redirection: community transformation and community field survey

Taipei's Wanhua District was once hit seriously during the Covid in 2021. The students who lived in this area felt strongly about then situation. Under such situation, local community groups were the best vehicle to deliver firsthand and timely aids and support the locals to survive the crisis. Therefore, as the pandemic subsided, Leadership Camp worked with IMMA Space, a Wanhua development organization, to provide related programs guiding students to observe the environment, consider the problems and raise innovative solutions. The 2022 programs required students to apply what they learn into real practices, including improving the damaged stairs, renovating the recycle signboards and others.



Cathay's volunteers guided students with teaching aids to think about things that are wanted or needed and to learn spend wisely.

(4) Leadership Camp provided most timely help to the under-privileged families

Over its past 13 years, Leadership Camp has served 16,000 person-times and helped many under-privileged families. At the 20th anniversary of Eden's New Immigrant Center, Hungshing Hu shared: it was truly difficult for a Vietnamese mother to raise children along while her husband had died, but the Leadership Camp provided a place for her son Che-wei to go on holidays when she needed to work. It can be said Hung-shing's three children grew up with the Leadership Camp by their side. The Camp provides a solution for single mothers who bear the parenting and financial burdens at the same time. Che-wei said it was a worthy experience where he got to meet a lot of different people. What left him most impact was the experience where he assisted disabled nursing home residents to have meals. He learned how to put himself in someone else's shoe and he could relate to the hardships that his mother had been through.

No Blackout Should Happen to Remote Country Children's Learning!

Cathay has started regional partnership project to establish After-school Care Program presence, and has opened programs in Oyster Shack Village in Yunlin, Shiulin County in Hualien, and Sanxia in New Taipei City. The After-school Care Program aimed at providing a place for those children who suffer from poor academic performance due to family or financial issues. In addition to the support of operation cost, Cathay also provided Financial and Insurance Program at Hualien site to help establish right concept about money for children. Cathay's expenditures in this regard was over NT\$ 1.6 million (US\$ 51,646), benefiting more than 98 local children.

Little Grass Book House, New Taipei City

Under-privileged families in urban area may feel more deprived than those in other areas. Children from this background have no equal access to education resources.

Oyster Shack Village, Yunlin

In this culturally and economically disadvantaged areas, adults normally are engaged in work and there is a high percentage of children who are raised by grandparents or single parents.

Since its launch in 2013, Cathy's Dream Come True Program has paid out prizes of nearly NT\$ 25 million (US\$ 806,972), supporting 144 schools and more than 3,500 school children. In 2022, twenty schools were selected to participate in the Program, which included Jingshui Girls' Soccer Team and Hope Shine Junior Baseball sponsored by Meifeng Foundation. The challenges for 2022 included the

following fields: sports, art and music, environmentalism and science. Participating teachers and children set up goals and worked hard to reach their dreams.

Dream Come True Documentary Award

Selection process In 2022, ten teams submitted videos documenting their journeys and an external judge panel selected six videos that touched their heart. The award-winning teams were Puhsing Elementary School (Taoyuan), Taan Elementary School (Taichung), Likang Elementary School (Pingtung), Hushan Elementary School (Yilan), Hokang Elementary School (Hualien), and Iraraley Elementary School (Taitung).

Dream Come True Documentary Award and Award Ceremony on Dec. 27th

To expand the influence of the Documentary Award, the Foundation held the Result Sharing and Award Presentation Ceremony at Cathay's Concept Store. The awardees, judges and Ms. Hsiao-Lu Chu representing Meifeng Foundation all attended the Ceremony. In addition, the stories of these Dream Come True teams were shared in the event. Notably, Hokang Elementary School's teacher Ms. Shu-Han Yang is a TFT partnered teacher. She led a group of indigenous children to pass along Amis culture.

Furthermore, Ms. Wan-Yin Hsieh, the teacher from Orchid Island's Iraraley Elementary School, produced a film "Tao Minions' Extreme Project" which was raved as "a documentary to be broadcast on TV". The film documented the Tao children's challenges in rock climbing, river trekking and walking around Orchid Island.

The video about Puhsing Elementary School's Drumming Team drove many people's tears. The Drumming Team was composed of 30% of under-privileged students and physically disabled students. The team had revived from low points and even won the second place in the national contest. Now, they said they would work hard to win the first place next year! Integration of Group Resources

Internal Integration: Cathay United Bank's Advertisement Department introduced Green Island Elementary School and Lichia Elementary School to join Cathay's online finance program. Thanks to the remote classroom policy due to the pandemic, the schools perfected their online classroom equipment so that Cathay Bank were able to conduct online teaching for children, bringing professional finance education to the remote country.

External Integration: Meifeng Foundation supported the 2022 Dream Come True Program as partner and sponsored Jinshui Elementary School's Girls Soccer Team and Hope-shine Elementary School's Baseball Team. With Meifeng Foundation's support, Jinshui's players got to improve their nutrition and won the third place in the January national competition. Jinshui only spent two years climbing to the national top 3. A promising future is surely waiting for them.

Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship Supports Future Generation

Cathay cultivating Taiwan's new generations for 42 years nonstop!

Cathay has started to provide the scholarships to two groups of awardees since 2016. Each of the Academics Group's awardees who are financially challenged students at high school level shall receive NT\$ 60,000 (US\$ 1,937) for them to mitigate their financial burden. For the outstanding student groups who possess creativity and forward vision to address social issues, the prize is NT\$ 60,000 to NT\$ 200,000 (US\$ 6,456) per group.

For the past 42 years, Cathay has given out financial aids to almost 18,637 groups of students (including individuals and teams) with a total payout of more than NT\$ 213 million (US\$ 6,875,403), continuously providing resources to the future generation and laying a solid foundation for the development of our future society.

The 2022 Cathay Youth Excellence Scholarship went through a strict selection process and gave out a total of NT\$ 7.38 million (US\$ 238,218) to 89 groups of young students: Specific Accomplishment Group (24 individual/ groups) and Academic Group (65). Each awardee was presented with the award money ranging from NT\$ 60,000 to NT\$ 200,000.

Charity recognizes 24 groups of young charity practitioners

The award winners of Specific Accomplishment Group were the young charity practitioners who took real actions in a wide variety of fields. Their efforts included using arts to encourage children with development issues, promoting human right campaign, preventing the senior dementia, youth and seniors creating companionship and legacy, education for remote country's indigenous children, and causes for sustainable environment, such as marine creature conservation, smart and green building project, etc. To apply for Specific Accomplishment requires the ability to submit complete proposals. That was why the 2021 winners for this group were mostly college students. However, it was especially impressive for 2022 that two senior high school students stood out among applicants with their works. Senior high students not only take actions but also take the role for calling for more awareness in public welfare causes. We believe their efforts are soon to bear fruits in many places.

Winner of Specific Accomplishment Group: Taipei National University of the Arts

Approaching the Autism children's inner world with arts

Due to people's lack of understanding about the children with Autism, the students from Taipei National University of the Arts designed art programs to bridge them with the general public. Autism children generally are not good at expressing their thoughts. Therefore, the design of the program requires rehearsal, mock classroom and review. The goal was to let more people know about Autism and build a more friendly and inclusive environment.

Cathay Life Insurance provides long-term Support to and encourage university clubs to organize summer/winter camps for remote country children, indigenous children, and community service. Cathay also provides insurance planning service so that their activities were well covered. These efforts also help growing college students' humanitarian spirit and bringing new viewpoints and broad vision through fun activities to the remote country children.

Due to the pandemic, the number of college students who joined the camps dropped sharply in 2022, but Cathay still sponsored and supported 23 clubs from 11 schools including National Taiwan University, supporting 959 college students to do voluntary services. These camps were held in 13 counties and cities including Penghu's Magong, benefiting 3,826 people. The activities included summer camps, community services, voluntary medical service, case visits, and camps for elementary students. The insurance premiums sponsored by Cathay was NT\$ 52,137 (US\$ 1,683).

The Force of Life that Never Holds Back

Teenagers can feel confused and fretful in their puberty. Mixed Disabled Troup's performance inspires these young people through the members' own life stories. Targeting the teenage people, Cathay Charity Foundation has sponsored Mixed Disabled Troupe, the performing group composed of performers of different types of disabilities, to conduct charity performance tour at junior high and senior high schools since 2007. Their gigs aim at promoting the positive values and courage about never giving up on life and about self-motiva-

tion. In each event, one could always see the Cathay volunteers in yellow vest to assist the members accessing the venue. In 2022, Cathay worked with the Mixed Disabled Troupe to conduct seven performances, benefiting 5,000 people.

Cathay helps building a happy learning environment with equality and companionship

n its long-term efforts of responding to the issues of education inequality and urban-rural gap, Cathay has come to realize that "people" is the crucial element that lies in these social and education issues. People are also the most real and urgent needs for the remote

countryside. It takes commitment and longterm focus on remote country education to push for real changes.

Starting from 2017, Cathay has allocated annual investment of NT\$ 4 million (US\$ 129,116) in

teacher training and support system, sponsoring TFT program's 243 young teachers to go to the remote country across Taiwan's eight counties and cities and benefiting more than 6,500 students and the education they received.

More importantly, the ups and downs of the pandemic during 2022 reflected various kinds of impact faced by the remote country's education: entry barriers to digital tools, children staying home without interpersonal relationship, faculty's hardship to adapt to changing protocols , insufficient hardware equipment, poor class management, and lack of support from family side. During the course, TFT members demonstrated leadership, taking students, and even the faculty, to embrace the brand new teaching-learning model. Making online classroom as their priority, TFT also made adjustment to training program and provided digital tool training through collaboration with platform partners so as to enhance project members' digital capabilities. Furthermore, considering some places may encounter difficulties such as insufficient equipment or less than ideal internet connection, or lack of family support, TFT quickly allowed the partner schools to apply for digital devices, non-device digital gears, and emergency funds to make sure all the resources needed arrived on-site as soon as possible. During the pandemic, TFT managed to channel resources in response to the problems that may arise at the teaching frontline.

Facing the constant changes in the world, Cathay and TFT worked together to create a high-quality education environment and resources for disadvantaged school children in remote corners of Taiwan so that students can enjoy a "fair and happy education environment".

Cathay Say No to Drug with Against Wind Theatre and Han Dong H.D.A.

ccording to the latest statistics from the Ministry of Health and Welfare, one out of every five drug addicts has been exposed to drugs for the first time before the age of 19. There is a fair amount of them who have tried drugs due to insufficient awareness of drugs. Drug use in schools is a major risk affecting children's health and it is highly regarded by the government and the public. To this end, Cathay Charity Foundation integrated the Group resources and carried out diverse anti-drug campaign programs. Cathay Charity Foundation worked with the stunt performing group Han Dong H.D.A. and Against Wind Theatre to conduct anti-drug programs through a variety of performance, dance, play, experience sharing and singing and toured around

Taiwan's junior high schools and elementary schools. From 2021 to 2022, Cathay held almost 100 gigs, reaching to more than 30,000 students.

Young people's drug use is indeed a pressing issue. We believe there is no time to waste. Therefore, Cathay produced two anti-drug commercials and one documentary targeting teachers, students and parents in light of our consultation with experts, scholars and peer groups. The film documented the sharing from drug users, experts and scholars. Cathay also worked with the National Police Agency on anti-drug campaign through the use of the commercials and documentary.

Notice of the province of the program, a cause that commenced in 2004, aims at supporting underprivileged children who have financial difficulty or encounter major issues in their families for them to go to school without worries.

In addition to providing schooling grants, the Elevated Tree Program also extends its focus to sports. In 2022, the Program donated funds to 1,169 junior high schools and elementary schools located across Hsinchu, Miaoli, Taichung, Changhua, Tainan, Pingtung, Hualien and Taitung, benefiting 8,200 people. Moreover, the Program supported 32 sports teams to play in games, purchase gears and conduct training sessions. Cathay also sponsored the Sunrise Village Cup National Junior Football Game through the Program. Over the 19 years, the Elevated Tree Program has never stopped its endeavors. As of today, the Program has donated NT\$ 280 million (US\$ 9,038,089) and supported more than 260,000 under-privileged children to go to school.

Cathay United Bank Foundation held the donation ceremony on Oct. 12, 2022. In the ceremony, Nanao Elementary School's little players (winning the championship in Finland's Delfin Basket Tournament Tampere) and Jianshi Junior High School's judo team members (winning 4 golds and 1 bronze in National High School Games) were invited to share their reflections on the stage. Their efforts and achievements in sports lifted their confidence, focus and perseverance, which is especially impressive!

Cathay supports primary level sports for little athletes to shine on the world stage.

The 2022 Elevated Tree Program sponsored 32 teams, including Yilan's Nanao Elementary School (wining the championship in Finland's international basketball tournament), Kaohsiung's Jhong-Jheng Elementary School (winning second place in 2022 Pony League Junior Baseball World Series), and Jianshi Junior High School (winning 4 golds and 1 bronze in National High School Games). According to Chairman Roger M.H. Lee of Cathay United Bank Foundation, by sponsoring the school sports, the Elevated Tree Program provided funding to support their cost in enrolling the games, gears, and training. These support would help the students to raise their disciplines and team spirit and increase their confidence through the participation in sports contests at home and abroad. They would be able to feel the public support and move on to their dreams.

Among the members who received the support, a lot of them came from under-privileged or single parent families, or they were 2nd generation immigrant or raised by grandparents. Their coaches oftentimes need to play

the role of a parent. The sports teams are like the second home to these children. When there is shortage in funding, coaches have to find money. For example, the winning team of Jhong-Jheng Elementary School in Pony League experienced the hardships of fundraising. Their coach said he once felt so frustrated about fund raising. Right at the time when it learned about these children's difficulty, Cathay United Bank Foundation initiated planning and assessment and completed the sponsoring process within one month. Eventually, Jhong-Jheng Elementary School made it to the US and snapped the second place with three wins and one loss.

Jianshi Junior High School's judo team, or the so-called "the gold medalists in the tin house", had to bear the difficult conditions in a tin house to do the training and practices. The members' judo suits have been reused and passed on for years (some even older than 10 years) and become ragged. With the support from the Elevated Tree Program, these young judo athletes got to wear new suits and keep practicing and fighting for the unlimited possibilities for their life.

Cathay United Bank Foundation has sponsored Sunrise Village Cup National Junior Football Cup for six consecutive years, making it the international game that all Taiwanese soccer teams are eager to play in. In the 2022 event, 24 teams traveled a long way to Taitung to play the games held at Fengli Elementary School. With the spirit of caring the under-privileged children in the remote country, Cathay United Bank Foundation would like to support these children to explore their future!

Special curriculum helps develop children's competitiveness

In order to help children cultivate diversified learning, improve competitiveness, shorten the gap between urban and rural areas, and promote the concept of sustainable development and lifelong learning, Cathay sponsored Changhua's Siang Tian Elementary School to do buffalo painting to create local rural characteristics, and sponsored Pingtung's Checheng Elementary School a song for their hometown. Also, Cathay sponsored Yunlin's Gukeng Elementary and Junior High School to carry out recycling program, using coffee ground to produce new stuff.

Charity Partners Making Contribution Together

The managed Tien-Tsai Liao and Gan-Ci Liao Memorial Fund also supported Elevated Tree Program by sponsoring the collection fees and lunch fees for the students from Gueishan Elementary School and Taoyuan Elementary School in Taoyuan City. In 2022, the Fund had donated over NT\$ 730,000 (US\$ 23,564), benefiting 258 students.

From the interview with winners, we learned that each winner regarded highly of the honor of being selected into the Emerging Artist Exhibition. A lot of non-art students took much efforts to fight for an opportunity to show their works. Serving as one of the judges in the contest, the Chairman of Tai-Yang Art Association praised that the Emerging Artists Exhibition attracts high quality works each year, and judges need to deliberate rather prudently to select outstanding works. Emerging Artists Exhibition is an encouragement and driving force for the next generation's prospective artists.

Furthermore, the 2022 Emerging Artists Exhibition also held virtual gallery on its official website for more people to appreciate. The participating works were exhibited at Cathay United Art Center in January, 2022, for people to know more about these young artists of Taiwan's next generation.

Pei-Lin Chiu's works are full of colors and power. Her works in landscape, stills, figures or other themes are highly impressive, making people hard to believe she has only painted for about three years. Although Pei-Lin Chiu, the managing director at ETtoday, called herself only an amateur, she actually had gained recognition in professional competition. "Senses of Autumn" (which paints aspen trees) was awarded special mention in the 9th Taiwan Arts Award. "Blooming of Innocence" (which paints the Bunon girls in children's choir) gained the top prize of the 21st Exhibition for Taiwan's International Art Association.

Pei-Lin Chiu who had shown in joint exhibitions many times finally got to hold her first solo and charitable exhibition: Joy to Self and Dialogue of Time and Space in May at the Cathay United Art Center.

Innocence in mind leads to truth, goodness and beauty in works

For Pei-Lin Chiu, painting is very healing. She paints her true self on canvases, bring joy to herself and others. About three years ago, Chiu saw a beautiful oil painting in a friend's house, and she decided to start painting. "Painting makes me feel happy and calm," said she. She often stays in her studio for seven hours without getting out. As a perfectionist, she wants to do everything to the best, and painting is no exception. Chiu has evolved from a layperson knowing nothing about painting to a well-established artist who can delicately control all the details such as the dimension adaptation, layers, colors. During the course when she learned painting from Te-Min Chang, she improved her skills and came to realize many precious lessons about life. When talking about the late master who enlightened her path to art, Chiu's words were full of gratitude.

All of the proceeds from Joy to Self and Dialogue of Time and Space were donated for charity.

"You have to paint things that you like. Then you would only create works that can reach other people's heart." The wise words from her master pushed Chiu to create the "Fat Beauties" series inspired by Tang Dynasty's pottery lady figurines. She looked through lots of books to verify that period's women clothes, hair and accessories. She delicately paints their chubby face, almond-shaped eyes

and slender eyebrows, and tiny lips. Each of the "Fat Lady" wears unique vibe and facial expression. Some of them sit, some stand, some hold instruments in their arms, and others look preoccupied under blooming trees. It feels that these beautiful Tang ladies seem have gone through time and space, telling their stories with a transformed new look. "Blooming of Innocence" paints the portrait of a Bunun girl in the indigenous children's choir. The girl in the painting has bright eyes and an innocent smile According to Chiu, Vox Nativa Taiwan has devoted to improve indigenous children's education and pass on the indigenous culture. She wants more people to see these talented kids and their difficulty through her paintings.

The Exhibition of Joy to Self and Dialogue of Time and Space included almost 40 works of three series of Blooming of Innocence, Fat Beauties and Light and Shadow and one work by Master Te-Min Chang. "My father was always my strongest support. He loved me and tolerated everything about me." Chiu's father passed away in 2020. Looking at the photos taken with him at the joint exhibition in the past, she was overwhelmed by emotions and memories. Growing up, she had received lots of influence from her father's words and deeds. Now, she is full of gratitude, often reminding herself to give back to the society with what she has taken from the society. All the proceeds from this exhibition were donated to Vox Nativa Taiwan and Chuang-Huan Chiu's Cultural Foundation.

e-Min Chang, the god son of Master Pu Hsin-Yu, passed away in Taipei at age of 80 last year. Chang's disciple Pei-Yun Feng followed his wish, holding 2022 Te-Min Chang and Pei-Yun Feng's Duo Exhibition at the first anniversary of his death. Te-Min Chang was born in Chechiang, China. He graduated from the Fine Art Department in Guadong Liberal College. Te-Min Chang's father was Tsung-Yao Chang, the secretary and butler of Pu Hsin-Yu, the late Qing Dynasty's famous artist. Te-Min Chang, when he was still a child, drew a fish on Pu Hsin-Yu's desk and was raved by Pu. Since then, Te-Min Chang determined to become a painter when he grew up. Later, upon his parents' arrangement, he completed the rituals and became Pu's god son. Te-Min Chang loved to draw fish. The fish he drew swim freely with ease. In 1979, Te-Min Chang moved to Hong Kong from Guanzhou, China, and further moved to Taiwan in 1990. At the age of 50, he started taking disciples to teach painting.

When commenting on Te-Min Chang's art, Shaozheng Hou, the famous Hong Kong artist, said, "You need to be obsessed about things to be able to paint things with souls. That is exactly how viewers feel about Chang's paintings. He gives intense visual tension in his forest, lotus pond, golden carps, flowers.... Very impressive." Hong Kong's Chinese University and Baptist University's guqin instructor Sidi Su also gave praises to Chang's works: His innate talents combined with his accumulative cultivation throughout the years have formed a propelling force from inside out and thus achieved his works. This is not something happening by chance."

Pei-Yun Feng was born in Yunlin. She graduated from Shi Chien College and went to Paris for short-term study in 1986. Feng had learned from Te-Min Chang for more than a decade. "What Master Chang taught me was not to paint what you see from your eyes, but to paint what is conceived in your mind. This is called the imagery. The traditional aesthetics is reflected by imagery", said Feng. In memory of the late master, "I would like to walk through the path he used to take, to see the sceneries in his paintings and to go to the places where he liked to do sketches".

The 2022 Te-Min Chang and Pei-Yun Feng's Duo Exhibition showed 47 oil paintings, including Te-Min Chang's 21 works on the themes of flowers, fish, figures, stills, landscape and creative combinations, and Pei-Yun Feng's 26 pieces of works on flowers, animals, and sketches.

Warmth Palette (Aug. 6 - 27)

Shu-Ling Chen's Oil Solo Exhibition

n this solo exhibition, Shu-Ling Chen wanted to present warm and beautiful pictures to the audience through her palette and brushes. She integrated the Eastern ink lines and Western structures and colors to combine realism, impressionist and abstract expression. By bridging the East and the West, Chen intended to present a new kind of aesthetics through her style.

In terms of the subjects, Chen preferred all

kinds of flowers, such as the gorgeous roses, refreshing lilies and fragrant jasmines, each presenting its own character. What she loved the most is peony. In the Eastern aesthetics, peony represents elegance, luxury and prosperity. She tried to use colors and lines to deconstruct and re-interpret peonies. By using the experience of Chinese ink painting to bring western colors into new abstract elements, she set free the colors and achieved the spiritual level of art.

Breaking through for new level of art

Deep down in her memory, Shu-Ling Chen always remembers spending time with her mother washing clothes by the river when she was a child. Even though she had traveled to many places in the world, she still has a place reserved in her mind: Taiwan's beautiful mountains. Chen is in love of Taiwan's 100 peaks. Standing upright on the island, the heroic appearances of these mountains can be seen from any where in Taiwan. With tenderness and fortitude, they are magnificent but not belittling, which so much echoes to the characters of Taiwanese: positive, humble and resilient. Intending to make a special interpretation, Shu-Ling Chen broke the traditional framework by applying surreal and image segmentation skills, and boldly incorporating Chuck Close's gridding style to express the concept in her paintings. The subjects of each painting were depicted into countless gridded images, looking lifelike from afar but not so much up-close. Her works, as a result, seem to switch between being real and surreal. Especially, those majestic mountains were infused with ethereal and zen elements. Chen looked forward to touching the heart of viewers while she

sought to reach new level in art.

Looking back, Chen felt that she had reached the point where she could knock on the door but hadn't yet stepped into the temple of art. She gave thanks to many of her teachers at different stages of life. She had benefited much from them. She also expected herself to keep moving forward so as to paint her life into a beautiful picture.

Hidden Treasure (Sep. 3 - Oct. 1)

By doing so, Cathay intended to raise the public's awareness about the remote country children's situation. At the same time, Cathay also hoped that these children could go to school without any worries and could pay back to the society when they grow up.

Since 2002, Cathay Charity Foundation's staff have full-heartedly responded to the company's appeal by supporting the Winter Warmth Program altogether. From donating money, preparing for the events, to going to the remote country to deliver the goods to the children, they spare no efforts just to pass on care and warmth to the children. Many of them say this is the most meaningful cause throughout the year.

Cathay's Winter Warmth Program has lasted uninterruptedly for 21 years. The 2022 Program included 108 events held in two terms: Dec. 1 to 30 of 2022 and Jan. 7 to 9 of 2023. The Program delivered Cathay staff's kindness to many places around Taiwan, benefiting over 8,800 children from 112 elementary schools in the remote country.

By integrating its corporate resources and business expertise, the Foundation calls on local volunteers and commits in Diversified Welfare Services for actions and services being carried out locally and kindness spread to the remote place in Taiwan. Winter Warmth Program can incorporate individuals' kindness and make it shine during the winter season.

Cathay Mobilizes People to Donate Blood amidst Covid

New record of 70,000 bags of blood for 2022

The sweltering summer heat that prevented people from going out, plus people's concerns about the pandemic, resulted in the low levels of stock at blood banks. To address the issue, Cathay Charity Foundation mobilized its volunteers to join the national summer blood donation campaign and called for its staff, customers and the public to join the cause even amidst the pandemic.

The 2022 blood campaign held 660 events around Taiwan and achieved a record high result by raising 70,168 bags of blood. Over the past 23 years, Cathay has accumulatively collected 559,991 units of blood (or 139,997,750 ml), becoming Taiwan Blood Service Foundation most powerful partner in charity.

Cathay Life Insurance's Chuan-chao-kao liaison office worked with Kaohsiung Blood Donation Center with the goal of raising blood for the front line and for the emergency. With a great result of over 5,000 bags of blood, the manager Ming-Ho Tsai said, "Helping others by donating blood has become a central cause for us. This event will be a long-term charity cause at our team". Throughout the past 23 years, Cathay Charity Group has made the record in which its recruitment over 60,000 for three years in a row. Cathay's commitment to the cause has won the honor from Taiwan Blood Services Foundation for 21 years consecutively. A bag of blood may save another person's life. Blood donation has become the DNA for each Cathay people.

Envisioning a New Kind of Senior Life at Cathay Happy Farm

Cathay builds 4 Happy Farms to support senior life

1. "Hen Therapy" in Changbin, Taitung

Chicken doctors arrive Changbin. Hen Therapy becomes a new focus for seniors.

As Taiwan's population of seniors has grown to 3.8 million, a lot of senior people now are facing issues of dementia, living alone, and reduced mobility. In 2021, Cathay Life Insurance worked with Eden Social Welfare Foundation's Taitung senior facility to build a farm customized for seniors.

Cathay sponsored the service expenditures for Eden to provide "Hen Therapy". The Hen-therapy Program invited the founder of "Hen and Traveler" Huang-Ching Yang as the instructor. She taught the social workers, home caregivers, nurses, volunteers and seniors to raise chicken from the scratch: coop building, chicken raising, chicken holding. They even named every chicken and they also shared the benefits of living with chicken and hen's gentle power.

Now they have 25 "chicken doctors" in the farm. According to the social workers, the first thing that many seniors did when they came to the facility was to check on those chicken. These chicken have become an indispensable part of their life. Cathay Happy Farm's Hen Therapy is a solution that provides empowerment and companionship to the elders. In 2022, the chicken-raising project was further enlarged to create the scale of economy for egg business.

The twenty chicken's "home" was built with all natural materials such as straws and husks

that were collected locally. The straw and husk waste contain lots of potassium and can be reused as manure for growing fruits and vegetables. This is an eco-farm that creates zero waste.

In Changbin, Taitung, many seniors stay at home feeling bored without fun things to do. They can suffer from degeneration physically and depression mentally. The Hen Therapy allows the seniors to have some degree of modest labor so as to maintain physical well-functioning. Most importantly, they have company. Their loneliness can be reduced. Cathay Charity Foundation believes in the spirit of Spreading Happiness and Hope and respond to the social needs by real action. Cathay Happy Farm's Hen-therapy Program aims at bringing more

resources to the seniors living in the remote country so that they can live a fabulous with dignity.

2. Building accessible toilet in Tungshi Township

New accessible toilet for the seniors opened in Tungshi Township, Chiayi

As Cathay provided services to Taiwan in the sixth decade, the aging society is desperately in need of care resources. In coordination with Chiayi County's Social Department, Cathay Life Insurance started providing sponsorship to Fish Pond Community Development Association since 2021. Although Fish Pond Village had a public place good for seniors' activities, the only downside was that there wasn't toilet. Thanks to local staff's report, Cathay Life Insurance provided funding for the development of the community. Chiayi County's Magistrate Chang-Liang Weng gave thanks to Cathay Life Insurance's long term support to local charity and the seniors. The accessible toilet was opened on Apr. 4. Magistrate Weng and Cathay's volunteers spent time with the seniors having barbequed corns and oysters. Everyone had a good time.

Cathay Life Insurance cares about seniors and how they live their life. Therefore, Cathay decided to donate a brick-made accessible toilet whose appearance was consistent with the village's construction style. The opening ceremony was attended by Councilor Mei-Hung Chiang, Cathay's Kung-Cheng Lai Assistant VP, Director of Social Department Tsui-Yao Chang, Director of Press and Marketing Ying-Cheng Hsiao, and Chairman of Fish Pond Community Development Association Jun-Hsu Chen. The local seniors were all very excited. In his speech, Magistrate Weng gave praises to Fish Pond Village's development and he thanked Cathay staff's family for offering this place for public use for free. The seniors could get together under the trees and cook corn cobs using the big stove here. The accessible toilet further added much conveniences to the seniors. He thanked Cathay Life Insurance for supporting the community development in Tungshi Township.

Since 2019, Fish Pond Community Development Association has stated the care program for the community. With adequate resource within the community, some seniors volunteer to provide services in shared meals, exercises and aging prevention in coordination with the County's Social Department and Health Department five days a week. With a big oldstyled stove and big tree sheltering the place, local seniors love to come here to hang out and children play around. So Magistrate Weng said the Fish Pond's seniors are very fortunate, and he appreciated Cathay Life Insurance's support to local seniors.

3. Cathay Happy Farm in Nandi Community, Changhua

The harvest from Happy Farm used for seniors' meals and local schools' lunches

To encourage seniors to live a substantial life and reconnect with local communities, Cathay Life Insurance has worked with Nandi Development Association for four years in a row to

establish Happy Farms that can fulfill seniors' needs. The Happy Farms allow the seniors to come growing vegetables and moving around. The harvest can be eaten and shared with the nearby social welfare groups and schools.

In order to carry out its care to the local seniors and under-privileged people, Cathay Happy Farm's fruits and vegetables are the results of social resources. People's kindness can be extended to corners of the society against the impact from the pandemic. The harvest from Happy Farm was eaten for meals. The local development association also provided free lunchboxes to Shetou Township's Public Health Center as support to their efforts against COVID. The community also prepared 10 free lunchboxes per day to those people who needed them during the hardships of COVID.

Happy Farm grows a lot of baby corns. The association worked with local farmers to provide access to local people for them to purchase fruits and vegetables as food supply under the difficult situation of the pandemic.

4. Shuangyu Community's Common Yam and Tour

Cathay Happy Farm's common yam program for delaying senior disability

The central goal of the Happy Farm is to support the development of friendly environment and the elders' physical and mental health In coordination with New Taipei City's Social Department, Cathay Life Insurance sponsored Shuangyu Community to establish Happy Farm in Gongliao, providing green programs for the seniors.

The Happy Farm Project received consent from Tehsin Temple's chairman to take the land for free and grow common yams and vegetables and fruits. The produce was taken care by local people and volunteers. The goal was to develop tours for visitors for the entire development of the local community.

New Taipei City's Shuangyu Development Association is also operating senior care stations by providing disability prevention program for the seniors. Going forward, Chairman Yu-Tung Wu, Chief of Shuangyu Li, and Chairman of Tehsin Temple would work together to put forward the common yam growing project.

In October, 2022, the land was plowed to grow vegetables, fruits and herbs. Gardening program was provided along with these hands-on activities for disability prevention purpose. In the next year, it is planned to invite local farmers and businesses to hold Gongliao Common Yam Festival for tourists to experience the fun in the field. In addition, the harvested vegetable can be cooked for meals, sent to the households in need or sold to tourists for the sustainable development for the community.

Cathay Life Insurance continues to work with the public sector, local communities, NGOs and other sectors to provide heart-warming services to the elders, creating health and social participation for the elders in Shuangyu Community. We look forward to taking care of the health of their mind and body so that they can share their life wisdom and make contribution to more people.

Cathay Volunteers Play Anti-fraud Games with Elders

Working with public sector to protect the elders' life-long savings

A ccording to Criminal Investigation Bureau's statistics, people above 65 are not the population with the highest probability of being defrauded. However, it would be devastating if one loses life-long savings at old age and such harm can be undone. Therefore, anti-fraud program for the seniors has received increasing focus.

Bearing such observation in mind, Cathay worked with the Criminal Investigation Bureau and NTU's smart senior program in 2018 to develop a board game "Guards against Frauds". With the help of Cathay volunteers, Cathay got into neighborhoods to hold board game events. During the process of games, police officers shared common fraudulent cases and scenarios and taught the seniors about the anti-fraud techniques. These events also allowed young people to engage with seniors.

According to Cathay volunteer Juo-Han Wu, the board games could teach people those common fraudulent methods and people would have deeper impression after police's sharing on real cases. Cathay's anti-fraud events could make a difference on preventing financial crimes. According to the police's statistics, most people are defrauded by investment traps which could sweep away one's lifelong savings. The board games allowed people to "experience" what frauds could look like and further know how to prevent. The board games helped people more cautious on frauds.

In 2022, Cathay held 51 anti-fraud events in neighborhoods and schools with more than 2,600 participants. Anti-fraud board games helped protect the security of people's wealth. Through these events, Cathay Life Insurance got to exert its own core expertise and help the police to maintain the financial order for the society. This is a cause for the academics, industry and government working together to build the financial safety net for the society.

In their feedback, more than 90% of the participants agreed that the Guards against Frauds helped them knowing more about fraudulent tactics and to know how to respond when encountering such incidents.

One of the participants Yeh-Chih Cheng-Chen said she felt really bad when she was defrauded many years ago. In an entertaining way, the board game helped her know more about how those scammers manipulate people's mind to defraud money away. She was grateful that such activities were arranged at Community Station for Seniors. The seniors get to learn knowledge about financial crimes and these games are beneficial to the prevention of dementia.

Cathay General Hospital Provides Longterm Commitment to Social Welfare Causes.

Providing Care to the Under-privileged Communities at Home and Extending Medical Aids Abroad

aking an impact to promote sustainable development can be a part of social welfare efforts. In addition to its endeavors in improving the quality of its medical services, Cathay General Hospital provides long-term commitment to social welfare causes, continuously providing aid missions to foreign countries and providing accessible medical care to patients from under-privileged backgrounds. Cathay General Hospital takes real actions to charity causes and respond to the UN's sustainable development goals by making efforts in establishing diverse partnerships and improving people's health and well-being. With its contribution in this regard in 2022, Cathay General Hospital won Asia-Pacific Sustainable Action Award in Platinum and Taiwan Sustainability Action Award in Silver.

Two Recognitions from Sustainable Action Awards

Since 2016, Cathay General Hospital has engaged in helping Paraguay to establish their own medical IT system to improve the country's hospital process, patient data management and the efficiency of hospital visits. The project has continued to carry out introduction of the system to medical institutions nationwide. Furthermore, Cathay kept training seed instructors for software development, digital teaching materials, and medical management to strengthen local capability in digital management with the goal of building customized system and local talent pool. The establishment of a comprehensive medical management system would help achieve sustainable development. Cathay's results in this regard received recognition not only from the Paraguayan government but also APSAA Platinum Award.

Furthermore, considering the need of current clinical practice on sepsis screening, Cathay General Hospital incorporated Emergency Service's expertise and developed AI Screening for Sepsis at Emergency Department. This innovative AI process is introduce to the triage stage. A warning mechanism and sequential organ failure assessment are added to the process so that the treatment would be given during the golden hour. In light of the AI introduction, results showed the associated death rate and hospitalization hours both reduced. This pioneering project of Cathay's won the recognition of 2022 TSAA Silver Award.

MOU Signing Again with Viet Duc University Hospital to Improve Bilateral Cooperation

Cathay General Hospital has conducted medical cooperation with hospitals in Vietnam since 2007. In 2019, Cathay signed the MOU with Viet Duc University Hospital, the largest surgery center and one of the hospitals with highest medical quality in Vietnam, and started its cooperation with it regarding the assessment and introduction of Smart Medical Project at Emergency Service. In 2022, the bilateral medical cooperation continued through the remote signing of both parties' second MOU under the witness of Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Vietnam. The scope of cooperation included talent training, medical management and sharing, aiming to improve both parties' medial skills and care quality for better bilateral cooperation and exchanges.

Donation to help Fijian Labasa Hospital to Establish Hemodialysis Center

Due to the pandemic, Cathay General Hospital suspended foreign medical missions in 2022 but didn't stop its aid to Fiji's Labasa Hospital. In its efforts to help the Fijian hospital establishing a hemodialysis center, Cathay donated dialysis equipment and medical consumables, sterile supplies for COVID prevention. Cathay also provided remote education and consultation, case discussion through online sessions to help increasing Fiji's medical quality.

Helping Under-privileged People Receive Medical Care

Throughout the years, Cathay General Hospital has set up designated accounts for donation and surplus appropriation, which are used to support those patients who have difficulties to pay their medical bills so that they don't have to compromise on their rights to health. This special arrangement has supported countless families who were hit by sickness or accidents over the distress. For some families, however, discharge from hospital simply means the beginning of more challenges: follow-up care, life expenses, or even funeral expenses, which may often cause people to fall into poverty. Therefore, Cathay General Hospital's Social Service has worked with external charity groups. Aside from holistic care, the support from Cathay's emergency funds is like a buffer, alleviating many people's burden. With the close-coordinated network from internal and external parties, Cathay General Hospital provided support to 305 cases in 2022, each of which was a family encountering crisis.

Cathay General Hospital is committed to giving back to the society by providing medical services. Cathay General Hospital will continue to work on charity causes with its medical professionalism, and extend its endeavors in international aids and carry out its social responsibilities with real actions for the fulfillment of UN sustainable goals.
